The 2003 SCCA National Convention has drawn to a close now. More than 300 members were in attendance and all received a wealth of information.

NATIONAL OFFICE COM-PLETED - Members that attended were taken on a tour of a completed National Office building and were present to watch the Topeka Chamber of Commerce and Mayor participate in the ribbon cutting ceremony with our CEO Steve Johnson and Chairman Tom Campbell.

SCCA-CART announcement: At the end of our Town Hall Meeting CART President and CEO Chris Pook spoke to the assembled to acknowledge that their attempt to form their own F&C group was not in the best interest of the sport. He announced that CART recognized the expertise of the SCCA and would now only use SCCA licensed F&C workers for its entire road racing in the US. This is a huge acknowledgement of our expertise and we should be proud to receive the credit. This agreement does not change any currently existing agreements or contracts that exist between regions that have already been staffing these events.

HEARTLAND PARK RACEWAY BOUGHT— also announced was that our own Ray Irwin, owner of Blackhawk Farms Raceway, has now bought Heartland Park Raceway in Topeka. He will continue to own Blackhawk.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS ITEMS—The BOD has instructed all program committees (i.e. competition board, rally boards, solo boards etc.) to develop and submit a strategic plan by the December

Under this program a new venue for the member 21 years of age and under was released called FIRST GEAR. This will phase out the Speed Freeks program, which has lost its drive. The cost of this new program will be \$45.00, which will provide for the regions receiving all of their costs back. The Speed Freeks will be phased out by June 1, 2003. All renewals will be accepted until then.

INHOUSE WEB SITE - The national office has now brought in it's own in house web master and

will be launching it's new site with in the week. This means that by the time you read this you should be seeing the change. The information on this site will be updated daily.

The national office is also in the process of buying new management software, which will integrate membership, licensing and accounting. Hopefully this will be in place by later this year. Any input you have from the regional prospective should be directed to Wendy Grillo or Sandy Abrahams.

## The 2003 SCCA National Convention By Angelo Gazzola, Regional Executive

You would think that a trip to Kansas City from Phoenix, would be a simple task. Well let me tell you, it was far from simple. The trip started out with my flight from Phoenix being put on weather warning. When I checked on what that meant, I was told that the flight might terminate in Omaha, Nebraska, if the weather in Kansas City did not improve by the time the flight arrived there. The interesting excitement related to that, was the revelation that getting from Omaha to Kansas City would not be the airlines responsibility.

The flight arrived in Kansas City, which was a relief. The flight arrived late, but at least at the right city. However, after a 55 minute ride from the airport to the Westin Crown Center, a number of convention participants were informed that the hotel had overbooked for Wednesday evening, but that they would probably have a room the next night if certain Wal-Mart employees were to check out. We were then sent by cab to the Hotel Phillips for our Wednesday evening accommodations. The Westin Hotel did pick up the cost of the alternative rooms, but by this time it is close to midnight. Because the trip to the new headquarters in Topeka was scheduled early the next morning, we were told to check our luggage at the front desk of the Hotel Phillips, after we checked out.

The trip to Topeka was well planned and was very informative. The new

SCCA building is nice but surely not opulent or excessive. The national staff seems happy and extremely motivated. I am not sure if this will be a permanent attitude, given they are for the most part all new employees. Pro Racing seems to have more staff than they need, but some of them may have been field staff, that will be needed in the Spring. The building was too small to entertain the four busloads of participants, but everyone made the best of the situation. We returned to Kansas City early Thursday evening, after a lunch/awards ceremony at a convention center.

Although I thought that things were looking up when I had a room at the Westin Crown upon arrival in Kansas City. I should have known better. Now I had a room, but no luggage! My luggage was finally located and delivered to my room by 10:00 pm, Thursday evening. Dinner went very well Thursday night, even though it was a working dinner. The dinner meeting was with the Regional Executives of Chicago and Blackhawk Valley Regions to discuss cooperative staffing and arrangements for the two events we will be con-sanctioning with them in 2003. That meeting went very well, and should enable those events to be well managed.

The convention sessions were well attended and informative. The Road Racing Steward and Competition Board sessions, were disappointing, to say the least. It is disturbing to realize that the club is at the mercy of some of the appointments made to various steward groups and the National Competition Board. The only appropriate conclusion that can be reached is that SCCA needs to improve the process and procedure used to appoint members to these very important national positions.

The most positive sessions during the convention involved the direction Financial Services, Marketing and Customer Service are moving to. The Financial Services area, under the leadership of Vice President Sandy Abrahams, has initiated a number of very positive procedures and processes, which will enhance region financial activity. This includes such initiatives as direct deposit of membership dues, and the ability for regions to pay obligations to SCCA through ACH direct debit transfers.

The marketing efforts of SCCA, under the direction of Vice President of Marketing Garret Mudd, are head and shoulders above all previous marketing plans. His integrated approach to marketing the club should bolster both recruitment and retention in the future. The new marketing materials, available to all SCCA regions, should cater to both the traditional age group as well as the younger group that we hope to attract. Those materials include a new VHS tape, which was absolutely captivating.
