Well the season is over, and we have two new members of the Milwaukee Region Board of Directors, and a new SCCA National Director from Milwaukee Region. Yes, for those of you who have not yet heard, Mike Engelke was elected to the National SCCA Board of Directors by a 200-vote margin, out of the approximately 1,400 votes cast. I want to publicly thank the Milwaukee Board of Directors and the members of Milwaukee Region for their professional behavior through the entire national election process. The fairness and objectivity exhibited by all region officials and members says a lot about the class of our region. I did not want to say anything during the election, but I wish all regions had taken the same "High Road," approach during the election.

Our two new Milwaukee Region Board members are, Jeff Cashmore and Cheryl Barnes. Jeff Cashmore has served on the Solo Committee for a couple of years, and I am sure he will bring the same excellence to the Board of Directors. Cheryl Barnes has served on the Marketing and Public Relations Committee, for the last year and like Jeff, will bring her level of excellence demonstrated on that committee to the board.

Milwaukee Region has a lot of accomplishments to be proud of in 2003. Road Racing, Solo, and Rally have all contributed to event and financial achievements that will be difficult to duplicate in future racing seasons. There will be very few changes in the staff that will carry out the programs in 2004, so I have no doubt that we have every chance to repeat with a strong showing in 2004.

We will have a reduced scope of operations in 2004, as we will not be responsible for the accounting and administration of the Quad Driver's School/Regional in 2004, nor will we be handling the financial matters for the Area Five TRO Championship Series or

transponder activities. We will still be involved in the Drivers School/Regional event as a co–sponsor. In addition we will put on four Milwaukee Region SCCA races during 2004, two national races and two regional races.

We will start the season off with the Mueller National at Blackhawk Farms Raceway, on May 22^{nd} , the season continues with the Rennen Double Regional at Blackhawk Farms Raceway, on June 5^{th} . On June 26^{th} we will move to Road America and present the Susie Bonneau Double Regional, followed by our showcase CAT National on July 24^{th} .

In addition to the four SCCA races the region will put on, the region will provide support for two vintage races held at Road America. The BRIC will be held on July 17th, and the VSCDA Fall Festival will be held on September 18th.

As I pointed out during the Annual Meeting, this has definitely been the "Year of the Driver." We have five Milwaukee Region members who have earned national championships, and a great number of competitors have earned significant honors in pro racing, national, divisional, and Area Five championship series. I have prepared summaries of those achievements, which appear in this copy of the DRIFT.

The 2003 season culminated with our Annual Meeting, which was one of the most well attended Annual Meetings in recent years. With the exception of some problems with dinner, the event went very smoothly, and honored our workers and competitors. An excellent speaker capped off the dinner itself. Mr. David Hobbs captivated the audience with his extremely interesting and witty stories about his racing career. It is no wonder he has done so well in motor sports commentating.

The problem with dinner was created by the caterer running out of the main

course for the dinner, before all of the tables were served. The reason for the caterer running out of the main course was not a simple one. The reasons for the problem are shared by Milwaukee Region, some of the participants, and in a minor way the caterer.

Milwaukee Region contributed to the problem by:

- 1 Allowing additional participants to join the event, without notifying the caterer.
- 2 Not providing adequate crowd control and controlling who was seated and served.

Participants contributed to the problem by:

- 1 —Taking more food than they should have, in some cases more than they could eat.
- 2—<u>Attending the event without</u> registering or paying for their participation!

The caterer contributed to the problem by:

— Recommending that participants be allowed to serve themselves, which led to a number of early diners over serving themselves.

I addressed the problem at the event by refunding the entry fees for the last two tables served, which did not receive any main course entrees. I was quite embarrassed and disappointed when at least three couples that I attempted to give refunds to, admitted that they had not registered or paid for the dinner.

After recognizing that we had nonregistered participants at the event, it was determined that the caterer had provided a total of 240 seating positions for the dinner, 238 of which were inhabited. We only had 224 paid participants, so at least 14 of the attendees were not registered for the event. The non-registered participants were not the only cause of the problem, but represented the majority of the excess demand on the serving line.

I find it very disturbing that members of our region would engage in this kind of behavior, and hope that it would never occur in the future. Milwaukee Region refunded approximately \$500 in entry fees, because of the actions of a few.

In the final analysis, Milwaukee Region is responsible for the disappointment experienced by some of the participants at the Annual Meeting. As the Regional Executive that burden falls on me, and I apologize for the region to anyone whose experience was less than positive, on what should have been a pleasurable evening. On the pragmatic side, I hope that the refunds helped to soothe the disappointment. For those who felt that more attendees should have received refunds, I understand your positions, but I had to make a decision that was fair to both the participants and the region.


