

Elkhart Lake June 29, 2007 Formula Ford and Elkhart Lake's Road America have been a natural fit ever since the first Formula Ford race in North America back in 1969. Long recognized as the training ground of choice for future F1, Champ Car, and prototype sports car drivers, Formula Ford has produced more stars than any other entry level class.

World Driving Champions Ayrton Senna, Emerson Fittipaldi, James Hunt, Nigel Mansell, Damon Hill, Jody Scheckter, Mika Hakkinen and Michael Schumacher all drove Formula Fords. Indy 500 drivers Michael Andretti, Danny Sullivan, Jimmy Vasser John Paul Jr, Eddie Cheever, Paul Tracy and Dan Weldon all learned race craft in Formula Ford. Sports car champions James Weaver, Andy Wallace, JJ Lehto, Stefan Johansson, Jan Lammers, Geoff Brabham and Didier Theys all raced Formula Fords. Enjoy a drive along some of the best all-paved driving roads in Wisconsin's Northwoods, while playing a game of roadside trivia.



The Tupper Chronicles

An Outing at the Country Club Joliet by Steve Tupper

In 2008, I worked all three days of the June Mapquest offered curiously complex direc- compared to the seven turns at BFR. Sprints for the first time in years. Three days on corner 11 was a lesson in alertness and stress management. Several serious crashes occurred that required quick flag response and accurate radio communications. I'd discovered another "alert" factor that Saturday when I dived into the Chicago Region corner track bag and pulled out what I thought was insect repellent and proceeded to spray it upon my body parts. Oops! I had just sprayed myself with BUG KILLER. Alert! Be sure to read label before consuming. Concerned workers kept an eve on me for the rest of the day for any strange physical or mental abnormalities. Nothing new there! As humor columnist Dave Barry would say, "Bug Killer... that's a cool name for a band." My cool names for bands often seem to parallel course has a similar T&S setup and at this aging related phenomena; ie, Geezer, Synapse Collapse, and the Screaming Bowels with their hits "My Bowels are Screaming"and "Colonoscopy Blues".

At the Sprints I had heard about a PDX school to be held at Autobahn track in Joliet, Il. sanctioned by Chicago Region. It would be a one day event on Friday, August 15 (2008). Cost was only \$100 as an incentive for workers to stay for the weekend's National race. This was a great opportunity to not only visit the facility for the first time, but to work corners and drive straights only. The school was to take on a track that I've never seen all in one weekend.

Autobahn's website offered the event application, schedules, rules and a map of the facility. To my surprise, there were two tracks; a 1.5 mi. north track with 9 turns and a larger 2.1 mi. south track consisting of 15 turns with a spacious paddock in between the two courses. The north track is primarily used by private residents. Most of the club racing is done on the south course. However, there are times when the two tracks are combined to make a 3.51 mile track with 23 turns.

First thing was to prepare for a three day weekend. Pack PDX essentials like tools, jack & jack stands, two spare wheels, air tank, helmet. Then stuff the corner gear such as duffel bag, sleeping bag, pillow and ice cooler all into a two door Sentra.

tions for a guy who travels to or through the Chicago area only once a year. It was a By the third run things became more famillengthy trip due to inherent construction. Approaching the area, I found that Chicagoland Speedway and the Route 66 track loomed not far from "les country club du Joliet".

It was evident how well this place was put together. Once registered, you pass the gate on to the long east paddock road. A roundabout displays the American flag as its central feature. Concession and fuel stations are nearby. Further west lay large grass covered and paved paddocks. The south timing & scoring building houses all racing operations and includes showers, rest rooms and meeting rooms. The north time, about 4:30 P.M., private members were doing hot laps in some fairly hot machinery. SCCA had just finished a test day on the south track for the weekend's Chicago Region National.

There were plenty of familiar faces to converse with before the first PDX meeting. Tony Machi represented our region at the meeting. Chicago Region's Peter Allen and Jim Marinangel were the co-chief instructors. This school was restricted to street legal cars with passing on designated place from 5:30 to 8:30 P.M. We had to hustle so each group (advanced, intermediate and novice) got a familiarization lap with an instructor plus three ten minute sessions before dark.

This was a complex track. Like Gingerman in Michigan; there's lots of turns on this 2.1 mile track. Corners 1 and 2 form a right hand double apex sweep, then left at 3 and downhill over a lagoon bridge and up to fast left hand corner 4. Short straight to left 5 with descent to double apex right at 6. Then go flat out through a right hand kink at 7, brake hard for tight rights at 8 and 9 and tight left through 10. A long straight awaits from 10 to 11. After hard braking into 11, there is a short right and left into 12 followed by the last short straight to 13. At corner 14 you choose either the pit entrance or continue past 15 and the front straight past start. Whew! It's a lot of work Cont'd on page 9

iar. The last session required headlights. Night driving school; Interesting! The debrief meeting lasted until 10 pm. I paddocked near the latrines (up wind, of course) and transformed my car into a motel room. The port-a-johns were high tech. They had foot pump flushers and a hinged plate under your bottom to prevent "back splash butt." Some really thirsty Illinois insects left several large, itchy welts on my arms...could'a used some BUG KILLER music.

The next day, workers met at 7am. It was time to learn more about the course. During the van ride to my corner, it was evident why they called it a Country Club. There were mammoth, privately owned "dwellings" spread along corners 6 through 11 and surely more were under construction. Each house used the whole first floor as garage space for their "toys" and the second floor living space had upper decks facing the track. The whole family and guests could watch racing while enjoying a meal or drinks under umbrellas. We later had our Saturday night party at one of these; a mini-museum with vintage cars, racing artifacts, framed paintings & photos and enough room for catering over 100 folks. I worked corner 5 on Saturday. My fellow workers were Greg Creamer and Kim Joiner. These two had me bent over with laughter all day. I tried to contribute to the joviality by demonstrating my "Danica walk" only to trip on the flag stand and gouge my shin. "That's gonna leave a scar," I said, and it did.

The big racing incident at our corner was when Milwaukee Region's Mike Sturm spun in spectacular fashion. While swiftly exiting corner 4, he slid off the track and spun toward our corner station. We did have a protective circular armoo, but we had no time to bail; it happened that quickly. Mike's Honda spun BEHIND the station, missed us and another barrier and came to rest in the weeds. No harm done, he continued. We breathed a sigh of relief and surmised how we dodged a bullet.

MINOR WAIVER REMINDER

Every minor (under the age of 18) needs a signed minor waiver in order to be able to enter the track premises. A new waiver must be filled out each <u>CALENDAR</u> year.

The minor waiver form is a 2-part form. Only a parent or legal guardian can sign the form.

ANNUAL WAIVER: For an Annual Waiver, the form MUST be signed by BOTH parents or legal guardian(s). The signatures must be witnessed by an SCCA licensed Registrar or the waiver form has to be notarized. If there is only one parent/guardian or if a parent has sole custody, the appropriate box so attesting must be initialed by the parent/guardian. A minor photo ID (valid only for the calendar year) can be issued after the new Annual Waiver is completed. There is a charge for this photo ID.

<u>SINGLE EVENT MINOR WAIVERS</u>: For a single event, the minor waiver must be signed by at least ONE parent/legal guardian. <u>The signature on this must be witnessed by an SCCA licensed Registrar or Steward whether at or away from the event site or it may be notarized.</u>

PLEASE, PLEASE REMEMBER, AND REMIND YOUR GUESTS AND CREW that if they are not the parent or legal guardian of the minor they are bringing to the track, the minor must have a waiver signed by his/her parent or legal guardian and witnessed by a licensed Registrar or a Steward or the form must be notarized.

WITHOUT A SIGNED WAIVER THE MINOR WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO ENTER THE TRACK!!!!!!!!

Families in Racing

Greg Gauper and a Brief History of the Racing Gauper Family By Steve Tupper

The Drift staff e-interviewed Milwaukee Region driver Greg Gauper, age 46, from Hubertus, WI. In addition to Greg, practically the whole Gauper family has been involved with SCCA racing and race working. Greg's dad and mom, Lew (former driver, corner worker and current starter) and June (sound control and crew for Greg) still work at races locally, in the SouthEast Division and at the Run-Offs. Greg is still an active corner worker at his home tracks BFR and RA. He's worked Run-Offs at Road Atlanta and Mid-Ohio. Both Greg and his sister, Liz have worked for 30 years with the club. Liz, a former F&C chief, worked F&C at the Run-Offs, has worked T&S and has been a race chair. Greg's wife, Tracey has worked many specialties including F&C. T&S, Registration, Sound Control, Race Control and Race Chair. She also works with the Competition (race planning) committee. Tracey has also driven at a regional driver school. Liz's three daughters are race workers.

Andrea Wegner worked F&C for several years. Sarah Wegner has worked F&C and Registration. The youngest is Hannah Roliff who is in high school and has worked in Registration since before she was in grade school. Just about all of these family members have achieved "Worker of the Year" in a specialty or similar awards from the Milwaukee Region. Additionally, Liz and Tracey have accomplished two of the region's highest honors; Liz, the Wuestoff award, and Tracey was awarded the Uihlein trophy.

Greg recalls crewing at age 13 for his father Lew, during his racing career (1976 to 1982). "Dad started out racing an Austin Marina in Showroom Stock C. He switched to a Capri for 1977 and scored his first national race win. He set several track records at Blackhawk, Road America and Brainerd to earn an invite to the 1977 Run-Offs at Road Atlanta where he placed 5th. In '78 the SCCA reclassified the car from SSC to SSB making the car less competitive. In '79 he campaigned a Mazda RX3 in SSB. Dad did not make the Run-Offs, so in 1980 he purchased an Austin Healy Bugeye Sprite for H Prod but suffered several DNFs. He revived the Mazda from retirement and won first time out. As luck and skill would have it, he won several more races and had top fives to finish 2nd in CenDiv. Dad entered the '80 Run-Offs and finished 8th beating several other division champions. In 1981 he sold the Mazda, managed a finish in the Sprite, and bought a Dodge Charger 2.2 for SSB in 1982. This car was not as competitive and he retired from active driving at years end." After several years Greg's mom and dad relocated to Florida and are still active in SCCA.

Greg drove his first drivers school in 1985 in his father's AH Sprite and got his regional competition license that year. He was honored to have "inherited" his father's crew chief, the late Vern Fitch. Other region workers have crewed for him including Ken Cramer.

"I campaigned a Honda CRX in SSC in '86 and scored my first regional win and won the Central Division Regional Championship. I obtained my national license that year and competed in my first June Sprints finishing 8th from a field of 16. The Honda was my daily driver as well as my SSC racer until it was converted into ITB class in 1989, placing 3rd in the CenDiv Regional Championship. In 1990 I had four victories, won the CenDiv crown and placed 5th at the inaugural IT Festival at Heartland Park, which was the fore runner of the ARRC event currently held at Road Atlanta".

In 1993, Greg took time off from racing to buy a house. He continued to work F&C where he met Tracey Hamilton at a 1996 race. This lead to a "long distance" romance for several years. In 1999 they were engaged and married in the Y2K. During this time, Greg built his current racecar, a 1984 Honda Civic and competed in ITC class for five seasons culminating with the 2002 Cen-Div Regional Championship

"In 2003, I converted the car to G Production and scored enough top 5 finishes to earn my first invite to the Run-Offs at Mid-Ohio where I started 35th and placed 25th. In 2004, I finished 3rd at the June Sprints and earned another invitation to the Run-Offs and placed 14th. I continued to develop my car and driving skills and won my first national race at Gateway International in St Louis in 2005, set a track record in 2006 at the Milwaukee Mile, and placed 6th at the Run-Offs in 2007 where my car was the highest placing "Limited Prep" car.

"In 2008 the SCCA eliminated the G-Prod Class and the car was re-classified H Production with a weight increase. 2008 was a breakthrough year for me as I won my class at four tracks (Blackhawk, Grattan, Road America and Autobahn). I capped off the season with a hard earned 3rd place podium finish at the Run-Offs and followed that up with a track record at the season ending regional at BFR. In 2009, I have a pair of top three finishes and I'm looking forward to earn an invite to the Run-Offs which will be held for the first time at Road America."

Yes, after several years at Heartland Park Topeka the Run-Offs will be transferred to Road America in Elkhart Lake. Surely the whole Gauper relation as well as many friends from several SCCA regions will be watching and cheering for Greg Gauper in the #15 Honda Civic. Nothing could be better than to win the national championship at your home track. Good Luck Greg!
